## Great Mission Project for Sunday School Classes & St. Andrew Groups Cookies for Kairos

**Why Bake Cookies for Kairos?** For many in prison, they have hit bottom — the lowest possible point in their lives. They feel isolated, cast out, alone, and unloved. For many, their families and friends have abandoned them. Often the cookies you bake are the only indication to them that they have not become simply a South Carolina Department of Corrections number. Each Kairos Weekend lasts four days. At the end of each of the four days the residents participating in the Kairos weekend take a bag of homemade cookies to each person in their dorm, cottage, or cellblock. Residents who have already experienced a Kairos weekend bag the cookies each day and enclose a verse of scripture in each bag.

**How Do These Cookies Help?** Your homemade cookies tell the residents that someone who doesn't even know them still cares enough to give a part of their life — the time it takes to bake the cookies — without wanting something in return. Such selflessness is often a unique experience for them. It also teaches them to trust. They learn we mean it when we say they'll get more the next day. Most inmates in our prison system are takers, not givers. This brief experience of sharing something of value freely — often with those they do not like — has a powerful effect. Someone has said these cookies are "seeds of love" being sown in the hearts of those who know so little of the love God's children are commanded to show forth to the world.

**How Many Cookies Are Needed?** At MCCI, 6,000 dozen cookies are needed for a single Kairos weekend. No cookies are ever wasted. If any are left over, they are frozen and used for the next weekend.

**What Kind Of Cookies Can I Make? Are There Any Restrictions?** All types of cookies are needed — dropped cookies, rolled cookies, even bar cookies. Dropped or rolled cookies should be about 2" - 2½" in diameter. This size does not break as easily as larger ones. Do not make thin crisp cookies as they break and cannot be used. **Do not use powdered sugar topping.** Once the cookies cool completely, wrap in plastic wrap or place in Ziploc bags and package in sturdy boxes. Cookies can be made ahead of time and frozen. While you are preparing the cookies, we ask that you pray for the people who will eat them.

### When Are The Cookies Needed?

The Men's weekend begins on March 14. Cookies should be turned into the church office by March 12. The Women's weekend begins April 25. Cookies should be turned into the church office by April 23.

Prayers are also needed for these weekends.

# Ash Wednesday

February 22, 6:30 pm

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. It marks the beginning of a period of reflection and penance. In the Bible, sprinkling oneself with ashes was traditionally a sign of one's sorrow for having committed sins. In the Christian tradition, Ash Wednesday also marked the beginning of preparation for the understanding of the death and resurrection of Christ. The particular symbolism of ashes for this day comes from a practice in the Roman Catholic churches in which the ashes from the palms used in the preceding year's Palm Sunday celebration are blessed. With these ashes, the priest on the first day of Lent marks a cross on the forehead of each worshiper. This practice has become a part of Ash Wednesday service at St. Andrew.
